SUBJECT: Regional Clinics and Coordinator's meetings.

On March 13, 2020, we posted on Arbiter regarding the abrupt ending to the 2019-20 men's basketball season and championship. The dates and locations of our fall Regional Clinics were also included.

After much thought and planning, we have decided that we will not have in-person Regional Clinics this year. Coordinators, please see below for information regarding the coordinator meetings. The impact of Covid-19 has affected us all. This decision has been made to respectfully coincide with the many cost saving measures that conferences, member institutions, and the NCAA have already put in place.

Therefore, we will hold two virtual Regional Clinics this year. The dates/times of the virtual Regional Clinics are as follows:

Sunday, October 4, 2020 11:00am – 3:00pm ET

Saturday, October 10, 2020 11:00am – 3:00pm ET

More information will be shared at a later date. **As a reminder, Division I officials must attend one of these virtual clinics to receive credit towards your championship eligibility.** Please mark your calendars accordingly.

In addition, the Division I Conference Coordinators will meet in-person in Indianapolis on Thursday, September 3, 2020 (committee meetings) and Friday September 4, 2020 as scheduled. More information will be released at a later date.

In-person attendance at the September 3-4 meetings is optional for Division II and III coordinators. Division II and III coordinators who opt not to attend in person, must attend virtually.
